PENALTY RANGE

FINE AMOUNT: \$700 minimum to \$2200 maximum

REVOCAION: 24 to 36 months

OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE ELIGIBILITY: Effective 9/30/01, OWI offenders with two or more offenses within any five year period are eligible for an occupational license one year from the date of revocation for the offense. If OWI offender does not have two or more offenses within any five year period, then 90-day waiting period applies. Completion of alcohol assessment/driver safety plan for occupational license and absolute sobriety during use.

Penalties are doubled when a minor passenger under 16 years of age is in the motor vehicle at the time of violation (see Section 346.65(2)(f), Wis. Stats.). A minor passenger under 16 years of age in a motor vehicle at the time of a violation of a third, fourth or fifth offense is a felony (see Section 346.65(2)(f) and 973.02, Wis. Stats.).
