Managing Latex Paint

Latex paint is **NOT** a hazardous material. Use these easy methods to dispose of latex paint properly in the trash.

Dried-out or hardened paint can go in the trash. Leave can open or pour paint into box lined with plastic bag until paint hardens. Add kitty litter, sawdust or commercially-purchased hardener (available at hardware or home supply store) to speed up the process. Toss out all materials.

Remember: Buy the minimum amount needed for projects. Use old latex paint for craft projects or see if friends or neighbors might have a use for the paint.

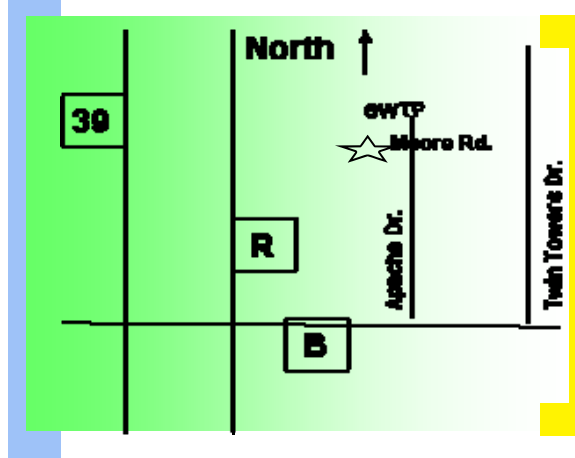

Paints/solvents/gas/etc: \$0.50/lb.
Cleaners: \$1.50/lb.
Fertilizers/pesticides/etc: \$1.50/lb.
Aerosols: \$2.75/lb.
Mercury: \$3.00/lb.

(\$3.00 minimum for mercury)

Agricultural : Pay full disposal costs

Prices subject to change

Compounds on the banned, cancelled, suspended list (DDT, dioxins, sodium arsenate, Chlordane, etc.) will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
