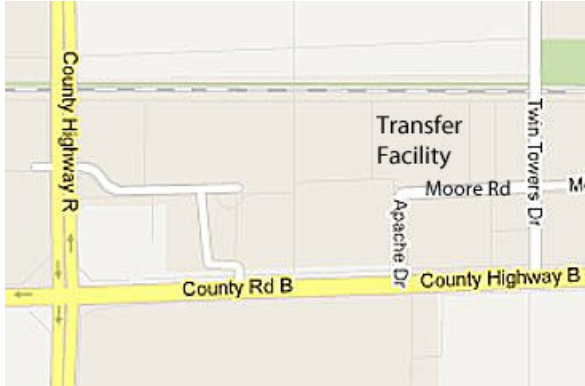


Location:

The Solid Waste Department is located about one mile east of I-39 on County Hwy B (Exit 153) in the Village of Plover Industrial Park. Turn north on Apache Drive.



The BEST

Hazardous Materials “Disposal” Solutions:

- Purchase only the amount needed for each project; don't over purchase.
- Use less-toxic alternatives:
 - * Vinegar & water for cleaning windows
 - * Borax soap & honey as ant/roach killer
 - * See the Solid Waste website for more suggestions.
- Give still-good leftovers to someone who can use them

Other Items Accepted for a Fee:

Appliances, Electronics, Computers, Printers, Televisions, Refrigerators, Freezers, Microwaves, Air Conditioners, Dehumidifiers, Tires, Batteries (Lithium Ion, Ni-Cad, Alkaline), Light Bulbs, Ballasts, and more.

Other Items Accepted Free of Charge:

Used Oil and Used Antifreeze (must be in 2.5 gallon or smaller containers with a lid and free of debris), scrap metal, lead acid batteries, and household recycling.

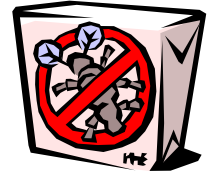

Managing Latex Paint

Latex paint is NOT a hazardous material.

Dried-out or hardened latex paint can go in the trash!

Leave can open or pour paint into box lined with plastic bag until paint hardens. Add kitty litter, sawdust or commercially-purchased hardener (available at hardware or home supply store) to speed up the process.

Then toss out all materials.

Remember: Buy the minimum amount needed for projects. Use old latex paint for craft projects or see if friends or neighbors might have a use for the paint.
