FIRST DAY

Stevens Point, Wis., November 13, 1928—10:00 o'clock A. M.  
 Meeting called to order by Hon. M. J. Mersch, Chairman.

At the roll call of the Clerk the following members answered present: Alban, David Simonis; Almond, C. F. Martin; Almond Village, O. A. Crowell; Amherst, C. A. Smith; Amherst Village, L. A. Yetter; Junction City Village, George Stertz, Sr.; Lanark, F. R. Lea; Linwood, Edmond Frost; Nelsonville Village, O. L. Gordon; New Hope, Casper Stoltenberg; Pine Grove, John Lowe; Plover, E. H. Supervisor Anton Laszewski of the town of Hull and Supervisor W. G. Bate, of the First Ward, excused.

The Chairman announced that the first order of business was the election of a chairman for the ensuing year.

Supervisors Mersch and Crowell were nominated for chairman.

Moved by Supervisor Pomeroy that Chairman appoint two tellers to take care of ballots. Motion carried.

The chairman appointed Supervisors Firkus and Martin as tellers.

Board proceeded to informal vote for chairman. Whole number of votes cast was 28, of which M. J. Mersch received 16 and O. A. Crowell 12.

Moved by Supervisor Crowell that the informal ballot be declared formal and M. J. Mersch be declared elected chairman for the ensuing year. Motion was put by the clerk and carried unanimously.

The chairman thanked the board for the honor conferred upon him.

Supervisors Crowell and Atwell were nominated for Vice-chairman.

Board proceeded to informal ballot for Vice-chairman. Whole number of votes cast was 28, of which O. A. Crowell received 24, V. P. Atwell 2, Frank B. Dent 1, and Carl Rosholt 1.

Moved by Supervisor Lowe that the informal ballot be declared formal and O. A. Crowell be declared elected Vice-chairman for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Moved by Supervisor Atwell that the rules adopted by the Board of Supervisors at the November session of 1920 be adopted by this Board and that said rules be printed on the reverse side of Committee cards. Motion carried.

Moved by Supervisor Dent that the present assistant clerk, Mrs. Ann McCallum be retained for this session of the board. Motion carried.

The annual report of Alan Galbraith, Assessor of Incomes, was presented to the board and referred to the committee on Equalization.

Moved by Supervisor Lowe that the Board adjourn until 9:00 o'clock tomorrow morning. Motion carried.

## SECOND DAY

Stevens Point, Wis., November 14th, 1928—10:00 o'clock A. M.

Meeting called to order by Hon. M. J. Mersch, Chairman.

Clerk called the roll, all members present excepting Supervisor

F. A. Lukasavitz, excused.

Minutes of yesterday's session read and approved.

Mr. Ira Danks addressed the Board in the interest of the Children's Home Society of Wisconsin.

Moved by Supervisor Rossier and seconded that an appropriation of \$500 be made to the Children's Home Society of Wisconsin. Under the rules this was laid over until tomorrow.

Clerk read the following report of the County Highway Committee:

Stevens Point, Wisconsin,  
November 13, 1928.

We, your County Highway Committee, beg leave to make the following brief report:

We met at the Court House on December 9, 1927, for the purpose of organizing. Upon motion made by C. A. Smith, C. F. Martin was elected secretary of the committee. A detailed account of every meeting held has been kept by the secretary.

The number of meetings held by the committee during the year is 39, and the expense of each meeting amounts to \$20.64.

The meetings were held for the purpose of purchasing right-of-way on U. S. Highway No. 10 and State Trunk Highway No. 49, letting road work, inspecting roads being built, approving of locations of improvements to be made under the gas tax law, auditing and approving gas tax fund pay rolls submitted by towns and villages, and purchasing road machinery.

Two four-wheel drive trucks were purchased from the Clintonville Four-Wheel Drive Company, at \$4,678 each, and the old Nash truck taken in trade. The committee purchased one Wausau Tractor plow at \$1,950 and two Wausau truck plows for 6-cylinder four-wheel drive trucks at \$675 each, from the Drott Tractor Company, also two No. 60 Russell Crushers at \$3,975.00 each. The Russell Grader Mfg. Company took in the county's present crusher, allowing \$3,450 on same and the freight on the new ones, which amounts to about \$140.00.

A borrow pit, 100 feet by 200 feet, was purchased from John Berghagen for \$75.00, to be used as a fill east of Junction City. A gravel pit was purchased from Herman Pagel, town of Almond, for \$200.

Twelve thousand feet of cyprus wood slat snow fence were bought from the Wheeler-Arnold Company, Wittenberg, and one thousand feet of steel snow fence from the Northfield Iron Company.

The sum of \$5,000 was paid to L. J. Seeger for property for new County Garage and the sum of \$2,000 paid to the Stevens Point Beverage

Company for land for future use in the housing of county machinery.

The cost of maintaining town highways to November 1, 1928 is \$6,489.75, and the county trunk highways \$17,000.55.

As there were numerous meetings held during the year, it was thought best that the secretary's record of said meetings be left in the Court room for the inspection of every member of the board, rather than have mimeographed copies made of same.

Your committee has checked the county highway commissioner's report and find it correct.

Clerk read the annual report of T. E. Cauley, County Highway Commissioner, as follows:

To the Hon. Chairman and Members of the County Board of Portage County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen:

In presenting my seventeenth annual report to your Honorable body, I am pleased to report as follows:

That we have surfaced with gravel 27½ miles of road, several miles of this work was fifteen feet surfacing.

We have also improved the County Trunk System of surfacing and installing culverts.

The County Tractors have graded 100 miles of roads for the Towns, this work being paid out of the gas tax money.

Several of the towns have graded several bad pieces of road out of the gas tax money.

I am also pleased to report that all contract jobs for concrete roads let in 1928, have been completed.

My report and the county treasurer's will not check, as he makes his report October 31st and I make mine about November 12th.

I wish to thank the County Highway Committee for the assistance they have given me in the performance of my duties.

Clerk read the following suggestions and recommendations of the Road Committee, of the Portage County Rural Letter Carriers' Association, copies of which were distributed to each member of the board:

To The Honorable Members of the Portage County Board of Supervisors:

Portage County has in recent years made great progress in building and maintaining highways. During recent years many miles of road have been graded and surfaced. The progress of this great enterprise of road building is the result to a very great extent of the untiring effort and zeal of our county highway officials and the several county boards of supervisors.

During this session you will formulate the road program for Portage County.

We the Committee on Roads of the Portage County Rural Letter Carriers Association, having in mind the good of the rural mail service within Portage County, and desiring to further the cause of good roads in Portage County, after careful study do hereby respectfully submit the following suggestions and recommendations for your consideration.

1st—We recommend that in so far as you are able that you extend support to the up-building of the more neglected sideroads of the County.

2nd—We recommend that a patrol system be devised whereby County road patrol men will occasionally patrol township roads tributary to their section of County or state highway.

We recommend that patrol-men be given year round employment.  
3rd—We recommend action to permanently eliminate "sink-holes" in highways.

4th—We recommend that action be taken to provide more uniformity in the condition of winter roads.

Inasmuch as the County provides for snow-removal from the federal, State and County highways and thereby thrusts hardships and economic loss upon all those who must travel both the plowed and unplowed roads, we hold that the County owes aid and assistance to the townships in snow-removal from the township roads. Therefore, we recommend that the County devise a system of snow removal that will besides providing for the federal, state and county highways provide to give assistance to the townships in snow removal from the township roads. We further recommend that in such a plan that preference be given to the rural post roads.

High grades, snow fencing and the cutting of road-side weeds and brush are essential in the prevention of snow blockades.

We believe that the time has come when no winter road system

is adequate or satisfactory until it provides for snow removal from all roads.

We, Your special Tax Deed Committee which was appointed at the annual meeting in 1927, according to the resolution which was passed by the County Board on the 28th day of November 1927. Pursuant to such resolution, and further resolutions which were passed from time to time by the County Board, your Special Tax Deed Committee has taken tax deeds on twenty-one forties in the town of Grant; tax deeds on twenty forties in the Town of Pine Grove; tax deeds upwards of one hundred and eighty forties in the Town of Eau Pleine.

On certain lands upon which tax deeds were taken in the Town of Pine Grove there were farm buildings situated thereon; these your committee had insured and since has received a tornado loss and loss from lightning.

About the time the resolution was passed and this Special Tax Deed Committee was appointed there were certain proceedings begun

by the Dancy Drainage District to sell those lands within the District upon which were delinquent taxes more than three years old; which order was made by the Circuit Court for Marathon County directing the treasurer to advertise and sell all lands which were delinquent and subject to tax deed. Such sale was made by the County Treasurer, the sale confirmed by the Court and the proceeds thereof are now on deposit in the County Depository for Portage County to the credit of Earl Newby, Treasurer of Portage County.

The Committee, as well as its members individually, made various trips to view the character of the lands, the timber if any, its availability for other purposes, to ascertain its value, if any of the land could be rented to bring an income, and to enable this Committee to bid at the sale such nominal value as in its judgment thought advisable as authorized by your Board at the Spring session of 1928.

Your committee attended the sale at the date advertised by the County Treasurer and bid on all lands up to what they considered a nominal value; through such bidding they were able to run the total sale price of the lands up to \$22,515.00. The distribution of such funds is in dispute. Some attorneys for the Bond Holders interested in the proceeding claim that the funds should be divided equally between Portage County and the Dancy Drainage District; some attorneys claim that on lands on which Portage County has taken tax deeds they are not entitled to participate in the distribution of the sale price: the County claims that they are entitled to the entire proceeds of such sale, except where some specific description of land sold for an amount to exceed the general tax. This question will have to be determined by the Courts.

Attached hereto is a financial report of moneys received and moneys disbursed by your Committee up to November 7th, 1928, showing cash in the hands of your committee of \$1,108.47.

These cars were loaded and shipped at the same as those weighed therefore should overrun about the same. I can not locate any more bills of lading, therefore it seems to me that the County Board should decide this question. The bill of lading weight of these 282 unweighed cars is 28,190,000 pounds.

Clerk read the following report of Committee on Settlement with County Board of Education:

Stevens Point, Wisconsin. November 26th, 1928.

To the County Board of Portage County, Wisconsin:  
Gentlemen:

We, your Committee appointed to settle with the County Board of Education, at this time desire to make a preliminary report.

Information had come to us to the effect that charges of various natures had been made through the office of the County Superintendent against Portage County, as well as against the State, which charges were said to be improper. After this information had come to our attention we thought it expedient and proper to investigate as fully as we could within the time permitted to determine the accuracy of such reports.

On Saturday, November 24th, your Committee took evidence at the Court House during the day pertaining to such charges. Our investigation, in our opinion, is far from complete and at this time we cannot make any definite or satisfactory report to your body. Our investigation as made on November 24th, however, indicates and leads us to believe:

First: That no systematic record has been kept in the office of the County Superintendent. In other words, that the record as there kept is such that there seems to be confusion and possible discrepancies, making it difficult for us to determine with a reasonable degree of certainty the exact status of the affairs in that office. The records may be proper, but we cannot determine, as above stated, whether or not the various features are accurate.

Secondly, investigation as held on November 24th, indicates as it appears to us, but of this we cannot be certain, that there have been overcharges made against Portage County by the County Superintendent's office from time to time in the past. The evidence as submitted to us leads us to believe that possibly Portage County has been overcharged on the mileage basis upon which payments have been made to the County Superintendent. Further, the evidence leads us to believe that possible overcharges have been made against Portage County arising out of charges made for automobile livery services furnished to the County Superintendent's office and which charges, as other charges hereinbefore mentioned, have been paid in part by the County and in part by the State.

The evidence also indicates that charges have been made against Portage County and the State by the County Superintendent for trips made by the County Superintendent and Supervising officers when such trips were not professional in nature.

This, therefore, is a preliminary report based upon incomplete evidence and we are, therefore, at this time not in a position to claim positively that overcharges have been made against the County and State or that there have been any actual irregularities. However, the evidence as taken by us warrants us in recommending to your body

that steps be taken so that a complete and thorough investigation of the affairs of that office may be had, not only by representation of the County, but by the State Educational Department, as well. Further than above stated, there is nothing we can bring to your attention nor anything further that we at this time are in a position to recommend.

Committee on Settlement with County Board of Education.

Following is the annual report of Marion E. Bannach, County Superintendent of Schools:

Stevens Point, Wis., Nov. 12, 1928.

To the Honorable Members of the County Board of Supervisors:  
Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen:

I hereby submit for your consideration such items from my annual report to the state superintendent as may be of general interest and a report of the educational program carried out in the schools of Portage County for the year 1927-1928.

At the annual two-day institute when the attendance was all that was expected, subjects that are to be stressed in this year's program were discussed.

A special section was arranged for the high school teachers where the discussion was led by Mr. Giles of the state department of public instruction.

Throughout the entire meeting a fine spirit of cooperation and professionalism was evident at all times.

The objectives for the year 1928-1929 were discussed and stressed to such an extent that much is already put into practice in Portage County schools.

#### Objectives for 1928-1929

The first objective for this year is attendance, every boy and girl in school every day. The fall work has proven a decided handicap to attendance, but since that time the attendance has improved considerably.

The cooperation of members of school boards and patrons in general has been unusually good. As a result the equipment necessary to carry on good work has been purchased. Sufficient readers are secured to carry out the idea of a Balanced Reading Program.

Written assignments one day in advance are advocated by members of the county superintendent's office. This suggestion is meeting with gratifying results. It means much work for the teachers, but they are doing it. The addition of black boards and hektographs is a decided help in this instance.

Nov. 3 was the scheduled date for the meeting of the Portage County Teachers' Association. The morning session was held at the State Teachers' College auditorium where a program of general educational interest and election of officers took place. The following officers were elected: President, Howard Teasdale, assistant principal, Almond High school; Vice President, Frances Barnesdale, principal Amherst Junction graded school, Treasurer, Carl Scheider, Grammar Grades, Amherst High School; Secretary, Elmer Knuteson, Grover school, town of Carson.

At noon the group adjourned to Hotel Whiting for luncheon where the afternoon program took place. Prof. John Phelan, an educator of national repute, was the speaker of the day.

The outstanding feature of the program was the part furnished by the teachers themselves in their five minute talks in which they

discussed their problems and solutions of the same in a most intelligent manner.

This association sponsors the prizes for the winners of the contests held in the spring of the year. It also purchases the necessary books for the professional library and used for reading circle work, according to the state rules and regulations.

The School Board Convention will take place Nov. 17 when Dr. G. A. Lundquist of the Department of Sociology, Minnesota University, and Mr. Geo. S. Dick, of our state department of public instruction, will be speakers.

An unusual feature of the day will be the musical selections given by children of our schools. The bands organized but a few weeks will make their first public appearance. Music is stressed in the county schools and remarkable results are already gained due to the interest evidenced and energy and time devoted to this subject by the teachers.

During the past three years literary and musical contests were held in this county. The success with which this work was met again reflects on the cooperative spirit of Portage County teachers.

Both the educational and agricultural exhibits at the Fair were Irene Green, Coddington School, Buena Vista, Edna Martin, teacher

represented by a large number of schools. The department of education is handicapped by the lack of sufficient prize money to stimulate schools and especially the high schools to bring their exhibits to the Fair. I would suggest a plan similar to that used in the awarding of prizes for the school agricultural exhibits be incorporated in the educative phase of the school exhibits.

One new building is being erected this year at a cost of about \$7,000.00. This school is located in district No. 9, town of Carson known as the Sunset Valley school.

This building is constructed of brick tile and modern throughout. The school will be completed about December 1. The members of the school board are Sylvester Hartjes, clerk; Van Asten, director, and Wm. Peters, treasurer.

Many schools have completely redecorated the interiors and painted the exteriors of their buildings.

The Equalization Law functioning for the first time this year is a godsend for many of our schools, especially to those having a valuation of \$100,000 or less. These schools will receive aid to the extent of \$1,100 which will go a long ways toward bringing them to the standard they wished them to be for some time.

The Portage County School News is published about once each month through the courtesy and cooperation of the Stevens Point Journal. Through this medium it is my desire to acquaint the people of Portage County with the educational program taking place in Portage County schools. Many good things are not credited in these columns due to the modesty of the folks doing these things, but it is my sincere desire to give to every one all the prominence earned.

Up to date two circulars were distributed to the teachers. An effort is made to distribute materials at institutes and group meetings.

The supervising teachers for the year 1928-1929 are Lucy Doyle and Rowena Allen.

During the year 1927-1928 I made 297 visits to 125 schools, attended 84 evening meetings and conferred with 110 school officials outside of office conferences.

About 2,800 visits were made to the office. 4,340 pieces of mail were received in the office and 6,890 pieces were sent out.

Sixty-eight per cent of the pupils in Portage County schools were taking the goiter treatment. The coming year there are more, but the exact number has not been determined as yet.

State and County Aid Construction and Maintenance During the Calendar Year 1929

Section I. The County Board of Supervisors of Portage County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the county for highway work in the year 1929 under the provisions of Section 20.49 and Chapters 83 and 84 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

Section II. Whereas: The State Highway Commission has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be One hundred forty nine thousand nine hundred fifty five and 24/100 Dollars (\$149,955.24) will become available at the end of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1929, under the provisions of subsection (9) of section 20.49 of the statutes, for improvement of the state and county trunk highway systems in the county, but that its exact amount will not be known until after June 30, 1929, and

Whereas; Twenty per cent of the said sum, or Twenty-nine thousand nine hundred ninety one and 05/100 Dollars (\$29,991.05) is required by law (subsection 84.03) to be set aside for the improvement of the County Trunk Highway System, in the county; the County Highway Committee is hereby authorized and directed to expend the said sum for the improvement of the said County Trunk Highway System during 1929 in the following manner, to-wit:

Patrol maintenance and such Gang maintenance work as the County Highway Committee may deem advisable and recommend that \$5000 be spent on County Trunk A in vicinity of Rosholt and \$5000 on County Trunk J on the South end from County Trunk Maintenance Fund.

Section III. Whereas: The State Highway Commission has estimated that the sum of Fifty Three Thousand Seven hundred Sixty

Four and 91/100 Dollars (\$53,764.91) will become available under sub-section (9) of Section 84.03, as state aid for improvement of the State Trunk Highway System in the county in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 83 of the Statutes:

Be It Resolved: That the said sum shall be expended in the following improvements, to-wit:

1. The sum of Fifty Three Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty Four and 91/100 Dollars (\$53,764.91), for the purpose of retiring Highway bonds.

Whereas the various highway activities, for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor, this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed, may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement of the same class for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year, and any deficit in any highway fund at the end of the year shall be paid from the next appropriation made for the same purpose, and

Whereas: the exact amount of the funds that will become available for highway purposes in the County under Section 20.49 of the statutes will not be known until after June 30, 1929, at which time correct figures will be submitted by the State Highway Commission the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments on account of the improvements to be made with such funds, as hereinbefore authorized from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1929; and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under Section 20.49 of the Statutes. ## RULES OF THE BOARD

### Rules Adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Portage County at the November Session, 1920

- Rule 1. The hour for daily meeting of this board shall be at 9 o'clock a. m. unless otherwise ordered.
- Rule 2. The chairman shall take the chair at the time to which the board stands adjourned, and the board shall then be called to order, and the roll of members called.
- Rule 3. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the clerk, and any mistakes therein may be corrected by the board; provided that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day shall be read by the clerk, and before the final adjournment corrected by the board.
- Rule 4. The chair shall preserve order, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal of the board.
- Rule 5. The chairman shall vote on all questions taken by yeas and nays, except on appeal from his own decisions.
- Rule 6. Every member, previous to his speaking, shall arise and address himself to the chair.
- Rule 7. When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is first to speak. But in all cases, the members who shall first rise and address the chair, shall speak first.
- Rule 8. No motion shall be debated or put unless the same be seconded. It shall be stated by the chairman before debate; and any such motion shall be reduced to writing if any member desires it.
- Rule 9. Every written resolution or motion shall have prefixed thereto the name of the person introducing it. And when ordered by a committee the names of said committee shall be endorsed thereon.
- Rule 10. A vote on any question shall be taken by the yeas and nays when called for by any member of the board.
- Rule 11. No rule of the board shall be suspended, altered or amended without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 12. On the meeting of the board after the reading and the correcting of the journal of the preceding day, the order of business shall be as follows: 1st. Reception of petitions, memorials, etc. 2d. Resolutions may be offered and considered. 3d. Reports of committees and consideration thereof. 4th. Consideration of miscellaneous business on the table.
- Rule 13. No account or claim against the county shall be audited unless it be made out in items, and duly verified, and be filed with the clerk of the board in the manner prescribed by law, except as provided by Chapter 153, General Laws of 1868, unless by consent of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 14. As amended November, 1898: All resolutions appropriating money shall be voted upon by yeas and nays, and shall not be acted upon until the next day after presentation, without the consent of the majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. It shall be the duty of the chairman of all committees to report work completed, or progress of work, upon the call of committees according to Rule 12.
