Clerk read communication from Brock & Company, of Chicago, Illinois, suggesting that Portage county take advantage of the opportunity to purchase county atlases at the price of \$7.50 per copy, which formerly sold at \$15.00.

Moved by Supervisor Starks that the communication be laid on the table. Motion carried.

Clerk read communication from M. W. Torkelson, director of regional planning, suggesting that Portage county appoint a park commission, provision for such a body being found in sections 27.02 to 27.065 of the statutes.

Moved by Supervisor Dent that communication be laid over until tomorrow morning. Motion carried.

Resolutions adopted by the county boards of Outagamie, Brown and Marathon counties, favoring such federal and state legislation as will have the tendency to curb chain banking, were presented to the board.

Dr. Miller, of the State Board of health, Madison, Wisconsin, addressed the board on the subject of prevention of diptheria among children throughout the county.

Moved by Supervisor Starks that the board adjourn until 1:30 o'clock this afternoon. Motion carried.

Your petitioners herein pray that your honorable bodies will designate the above described road as now traveled and laid out, (or as your honorable bodies may relocate or modify the same) as a part of the County trunk line systems in your respective counties.

Clerk read the following report of committee on buildings and grounds in regard to installing an oil burner in the court house:

To The Honorable Chairman and Members of the County Board.  
Gentlemen:

Your committee on buildings and grounds would report that they have investigated the proposition of an iron stoker and oil burner for heating the court house and have come to the conclusion and would recommend that the county purchase an oil burner of the proper size to heat the court house as it should be heated. The cost of different burners will run from \$250.00 to \$750.00 properly installed, including the tank for the storage of oil.

It is the opinion of the committee that they should not buy an iron stoker as was submitted during the session of the fall of 1929. One reason for the buying of an oil burner is on account of the excessive amount of soot and smoke that is distributed through the court house by the storing and using of soft coal.

We have examined a number of burners and would recommend that the county board appropriate a sufficient amount to purchase and install the necessary equipment to use fuel oil.

Gentlemen:

We, your committee on ways and means, to whom was referred the resolution for a direct tax levy of \$90,000.00 to be used for the construction of state highway 66 with concrete, would respectfully report as follows:

The above amount, together with two other non-recurring items amounting to \$23,000.00 which it is now known must be provided for and added to the tax roll for the current year, will increase the budget an amount approximating 50 per cent of the total county tax roll for the year 1929. We have carefully considered the advisability of adding such a large sum to the tax roll and are of the opinion that it is inadvisable to do so.

The resolution also provides for borrowing the money and doing the work this year. There is no provision in the statutes for temporary borrowing except for current expenses; therefor, under the resolution no funds would or could be made available for construction with concrete this year.

Your committee considers it proper and opportune to call the attention of the board to consider well the advisability of substituting concrete for gravel before finally determining such a change, from the standpoint of allotment funds now available or which may hereafter be withheld as available for use on this road. If it is finally determined to substitute concrete for gravel it is the opinion of your committee that the financing of it should be done by a county bond issue spread over a period of three or four years. It should be remembered, however, that there is no surplus gas tax available, or likely to be made available, with which to retire the bonds and such bonds will necessarily have to be retired by a direct tax on the taxable property of the county and paid by the tax payers out of their pockets. Your committee believes any available gas tax funds available should be applied to the retirement of the bonds and recommend that any surplus gas tax be used for that purpose.

**AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$138,000.00 SERIES "F" NON-TAXABLE HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT COUNTY BONDS OF PORTAGE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, AND FIXING DETAILS IN RESPECT OF SAID ISSUE.**

Whereas, at a regularly convened meeting held this 18th day of April, 1930, the county board of Portage county, state of Wisconsin, did determine by resolution number 1, duly adopted, to raise money for the purpose of the improvement of portions of state trunk highway system and the county system of prospective state highways located within the said county of Portage, by issuing non-taxable, semi-annual interest payment coupon bonds, to be known as series "F" in the aggregate amounting to one hundred thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$138,000.00) the proceeds thereof to be expended on certain specified improvements in proportions as determined by the said resolution number 1, adopted by said county board; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and of October of each year, both principal and interest to be payable at the office of the county treasurer of said county, to be numbered consecutively beginning with number 1, to be of the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, and to become due and payable within four (4) years from date and at such times as this county board shall from time to time determine; and

Whereas, it appears that 28 votes were cast in favor of issuing said bonds and 1 vote was cast against issuing said bonds; and

Whereas, necessity for providing funds for construction of said highways exists and it is desired, of the bonds so authorized at this time to provide for the issuance and sale of bonds in the amount of one hundred thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$138,000.00); and

Whereas, the statutes provide that upon the order of the county board section 330.23 of the statutes may apply to this issue.

Now, therefore, be it and it is hereby resolved by the county board of Portage county, Wisconsin, as follows:

Section 1. That it is hereby found and determined that at the county board meeting above referred to, duly called and held in the court house, in said county, more than a majority of the members voting thereat, voted in favor of issuing said bonds for the purpose of raising money to improve portions of state trunk highway system and the county system of prospective state highways, in said county.

Section 2. That necessity now exists for providing funds in the amount of one hundred thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$138,000.00) for construction work upon said highways and bonds in that amount or any portion thereof as may seem necessary to the body authorized to make sale thereof, are hereby ordered to be issued, and sold by the chairman of this county board, and the county clerk and the county highway committee.

That said bonds be dated June 1, 1930, be of the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, numbered from 1 to 138 both numbers included, be due and payable in numerical order as follows:

Numbers 1 to 35, aggregating \$35,000, due April 1st, 1931.  
Numbers 36 to 70, aggregating \$35,000, due April 1st, 1932.  
Numbers 71 to 105, aggregating \$35,000, due April 1st, 1933.  
Numbers 106 to 138, aggregating \$33,000, due April 1st, 1934.

That said bonds bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent (4½) per annum, payable October 1st, 1930, and semi-annually thereafter on April 1st and October 1st of each year, and be payable

both principal and interest at the office of the county treasurer of said county, Stevens Point, Wisconsin.

That said bonds be signed by the chairman of the county board and the county clerk in their official capacities, and be sealed with the county seal, and that the interest accruing on said bonds be evidenced by coupons thereto attached, maturing on said several days when such interest matures, and be signed with the fac-simile signature of said officers.

That said bonds be in the form approved by the state highway commission, as required by law.

Section 3. That said bonds or any portion thereof shall be sold by the chairman of the county board, the county clerk and the county highway committee, after such advertising as in their discretion may seem advisable, and the action of said officials in making sale of said bonds shall be binding upon their county board, provided that said bonds shall not be sold for less than the par value thereof, as provided by law.

Section 4. That in order to provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it accrues, and also to pay and discharge the principal, thereof, at maturity, there be and there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property in the said county a direct annual irrepealable tax for each of the years while said bonds or any of them are outstanding, in amounts sufficient for such purposes, and that there be and is hereby levied upon all the taxable property in said county the following direct annual tax, to-wit:

For the year 1930, a tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$42,492.50 being \$2,070.00 to reimburse the general fund in a like amount to be advanced therefrom to pay interest maturing October 1, 1930; \$3,105.00 to pay interest due April 1, 1931, and \$2,317.50 to pay interest due October 1, 1931; and \$35,000.00 to pay principal maturing April 1, 1931.

For the year 1931, a tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$38,847.50 being \$2,317.50 to pay interest due April 1st, 1932; \$1,530.00 to pay interest due October 1st, 1932 and \$35,000.00 to pay principal maturing April 1st, 1932.

For the year 1932, a tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$37,272.50 being \$1,530.00 to pay interest due April 1st, 1933; \$742.50 to pay interest due October 1st, 1933 and \$35,000.00 to pay principal maturing April 1st, 1933.

For the year 1933, a tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$33,742.50 being \$742.50 to pay interest due April 1st, 1934 and \$33,000.00 to pay principal maturing April 1st, 1934.

Section 5. That section 330.23 of the statutes of Wisconsin shall apply to this issue of bonds, and that the county clerk shall submit said bonds and certified copy of the proceedings preliminary to the issuing thereof to the bond commissioner of Wisconsin for his examination and certificate of validity.

Section 6. That all resolutions and orders heretofore adopted and entered in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed and all such resolutions and orders consistent herewith are hereby reaffirmed.

Stevens Point, Wisconsin, November 12, 1930.

We, your highway committee, beg leave to make the following report:

We met at the court house on November 19th, 1929. Mr. Steve Firkus was elected chairman, Mr. C. W. Precourt, secretary, and Mr. Carl Rosholt, director. An account of every meeting held has been kept by the secretary.

Fifty meetings were held and the expenses of each meeting amounts to \$21.12.

The business of the highway committee at the meetings held had to do with auditing and approving gas tax pay rolls submitted by the several towns and villages, purchasing right of way on state highway No. 66, certifying to the letting of contracts on state trunk highway No. 66 and federal highway No. 73, sale of county bonds, work with the gravel pit committee, purchasing road machinery, letting road work, inspecting roads being improved with gas tax and county aid, supervising and accepting paving on state trunk highway No. 66 and making preliminary plans and surveys on state trunk highway No. 66 for 1931 improvement.

Two Oshkosh 4-ton trucks were purchased from the Oshkosh Sales corporation for \$10,800.00 which figures are net after deducting 2% and trade-in received for 5 Ford trucks and 1 Packard truck. Three Galion motor patrols and two heavy duty No. 12 Galion graders were obtained from the Badger Tractor and Equipment company for \$11,760.00, which price is net after deducting 2% and \$670.00 allowed for Fordson patrol.

One P. & H. No. 400-3/4 yard power shovel was purchased from the Harnischfeger corporation, complete with 40' crane boom and 3/4 yard clam shell bucket for \$12,504.00 net. Two super-drive 5-ton trucks complete with power-operated Wausau snow plows were purchased from the Hi-Way Service corporation, for \$10,220.00 to be paid for at the rate of \$600.00 per month beginning June 1, 1930. We are pleased to report that \$3,000.00 has been paid on these trucks up to Nov. 1, 1930.

Two carloads of snow fence were purchased from Kelly O'Melia Lumber company for \$4.48 per 100 feet, total cost not known as bills are not in. 2,700 steel posts were purchased from the Guarantee Hardware company at \$30.69 per 100. Total cost \$828.63.

The committee also acquired two gravel pits, one from Andrew Stoltenberg, 2 acres for \$600.00 and one from W. E. Weid, one-half acre and the old pit for \$450.00.

The cost of maintaining county trunk highways to November 1st, 1930 is \$37,092.17 and town highways for the same period \$7,504.29.

As is the custom, the record of the activities of the committee are to be left in the court room for the inspection of the board or other interested parties.

Your committee has checked the county highway commissioners report and find it to be correct.

Your county highway committee recommends that Portage county purchase two or three more motor patrols, and one 30-ton trailer. The trailer to be used for transporting the power shovel, graders and caterpillars, snow plows, crushing plants and in fact, all types of machinery that is not practical to transport under its own power or on its own running gear.

We also recommend the purchase of two 5-ton trucks, and, if a snow removal program is laid out by this county board, we would recommend that the trucks be purchased complete with snow plows.

We further recommend the placing of Amesite paving on county trunk highway "A" from Almond village to federal highway No. 51, as soon as funds are available.

This recommendation is the result of our observations and inspections on this type of road; highway "A" at this point is in fine shape for Amesite and we believe it would be a good investment for Portage county.

The funds estimated to be available for the work in your county under section 20.49 of the statutes are as follows:

1. For the improvement of the county trunk system \$39,029.16.
2. For the improvement of the state trunk highway system: as federal aid construction on state trunk highway No. 73, the Wisconsin Rapids-Plainfield road, \$25,000.00, as state aid, location to be determined by county board, \$128,494.29 net.
3. For the maintenance of the state trunk highway system, \$52,397.66 net.

The determinations are tentative only. The actual amounts cannot be known until after the end of the fiscal year, which is June 30, 1931.

The amount allotted to the Wisconsin Rapids-Plainfield road was used in connection with the construction undertaken during the construction season of 1930.

We the committee duly appointed to investigate matters pertaining to the adoption of the so called old age pension, as enacted in sections 49.20 to 49.39 of the statutes, beg leave to report that we have duly examined into the matter, both by personal investigation and correspondence with judicial officers and superintendents of poor in several of the counties wherein action has been taken in this matter. After due deliberation we, your committee, beg leave to report that we cannot find that adoption of the pension would be of any lasting benefit to the poor in general over former existing statutes, in that it affords aid to persons over 70 only. On the contrary the law has shown itself to be productive of fraud and deceit on the part of relatives and applicants, who are under the present law liable for the support of such persons.

We also find that its adoption would oblige the county to set aside for the support of such pensioners a larger sum than this county can afford at this time. Furthermore that while cities, towns and villages are required to reimburse the county for two-thirds of the amounts paid as pensions, the officers of these municipalities have no voice in granting pensions. Further: we have been informed that a larger number of bills will be introduced in the next session of the legislature to amend this law.

We therefore submit that adoption of the pension at this time would be a mistake. It is our opinion, although it is not a part of this report, that the county should purchase or lease a suitable building in which to care for our unfortunate poor, which will be subject to county control only as has been done in Wood and other counties. Wood county has adopted a modified pension law by ordinance, taking in all classes wherein the county's action is not subject to state control. Your committee is ready to supplement this report by oral report at any time if desired by the board.

The committee representing the bankers of Portage county, authorized by your honorable body to expend the appropriation made by the board in the session of 1929 for the purpose of purchasing arms and equipment for Vigilante guards for this county, beg leave to report at this time.

Your committee called for bids on this equipment from all the dealers in the county who handled this material, and the Guarantee Hardware company of Stevens Point, Wis., being the lowest bidder, the contract was awarded to them.

The committee purchased in all 29 Winchester 12-gauge riot guns and 10 Winchester model No. 94 30-30 caliber carbine rifles, and ammunition sufficient for the use of the same. The committee, realizing that the sheriff's office was without adequate equipment in arms, purchased

six guns for the sheriff's office and six tear bombs, which are now installed in said office ready for use.

The committee also secured liability and compensation insurance covering the guards, and this expense was paid by the banks of the county. Included in the purchase was sufficient ammunition for practice shooting for the guards, and it is the intention of the sheriff of the county to hold several practice shoots each year to familiarize the guards with the proper use and efficient handling of the arms in their care.

Thirty-six guards were appointed to act under the direction of the sheriff, and guards have been located in every village in the county and in the city of Stevens Point and at other strategic points in the rural districts to protect the lives and property of our people.

Twenty-seven deputies have been sworn in by the Hon. Byron B. Park, circuit judge of this circuit, and nine more are ready to be appointed. Guns and ammunition have been distributed to these guards and the organization is now functioning in the county under the direction of the sheriff.

The committee feels that the action of your board in making this appropriation was a step in the right direction as the Vigilante guard will act as a nucleus for the future organization of a constabulary force in the state that will be used to protect the traveling public on the highways of our commonwealth. In recent years the criminal element has run rampant in the state and some action on the part of the counties and state is necessary to curb the lawlessness that has terrorized the people and jeopardized their lives and property.

By advertising for bids, the county was saved \$400 over the price given them by the state association.

We, the undersigned, owners of cottages at Lake Emily, ask your honorable body to consider the following suggestions, being under the impression that all money taken in from leases should be used for the general welfare of such county projects.

1st—The swimming beach should be deepened to a depth suitable for such purposes and make it more enticing to bathers and visitors.

2nd—That a diving board be placed to take care of these who participate in this sport.

3rd—Regular garbage collections should be made from the hygienic standpoint as well as general health and public welfare.

4th—Sundays and holidays, we would suggest a life guard to take care of any emergency that might arise during such times. One life saved is worthy of this consideration.

5th—The grounds around the lake should be patrolled by police; many conditions arise which warrants such during Sundays and holidays; such as this and above mentioned life guard would answer a two-fold purpose with the present business conditions, giving at least two men something to do for the county, therefore taking a place in the way of helping others in distress, and the protection of life and property.

6th—We would also suggest a gravel walk which would permit the public to reach the park without the interference of sand burrs, from the Somers boat house to the park.

7th—Electric light service. During the past season many deprived themselves of this service due to the attitude of the utility company raising the rates and adding a \$2.00 service charge per month in addition to the minimum charge of \$1.25 per month. This matter has been settled by the railroad commission and the rating is \$1.25 minimum from all cottages at Lake Emily.

This being the fact we would also suggest the committee to consider placing lights both at the park and the bathing beach, if not from the convenient standpoint, from the moral standpoint. With the cooperation of the owners and the committee much more good can be accomplished.

To the Portage County Board of Supervisors.  
Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen:

A report disclosing the aims and accomplishments of the Portage county program on education is hereby submitted for your consideration and approval.

In order to efficiently promote the necessary and proper training of boys and girls, scholarship is ever kept uppermost in my organization of work for the school year. With this in mind much time is devoted during the summer to the selection of good textbooks for the coming year. Since in several instances the pupils spend eighty to ninety per cent of their time in their seats, materials which are both educational and interesting must be provided for this time. This is the period where self education plays an important part in the child's school experience, and where to a great extent success depends on the proper and profitable use of the study period projects.

Every child is entitled to a sufficient supply of good books and these are being procured free in ninety-five schools. A number of the thirty remaining schools have a partial free text list. The number increases each year and soon it is hoped every school in Portage county will be on the free text book list.

A project closely allied with the provision of sufficient material is the school term and each year more and more schools are voting favorably the nine month session. In every school in this county report cards are distributed every six weeks. These in past years were provided by each individual school, but this year for the first time these are provided by the county superintendent's office. It is hoped that by providing the same type of a report card in every school it will standardize our method of using credits in the elementary grades.

During the past summer much time and attention was devoted to the building and equipment program. One new school was constructed in district No. 2, town of Plover, at a cost of \$4,300. It is a frame building with a full basement in which a furnace and fuel are housed, indoor toilets and a well lighted and heated playroom. The upstairs consists of a hallway, cloakroom, classroom, teacher's room and a library. The members of the school board are H. J. Smith, C. L. Wherritt, and L. Coulthurst.

Warm cloakrooms were provided in a number of schools. Remodeling will not be as extensive as it might be, because it is deemed inadvisable to expend much money on the very old buildings when a new one may be constructed for about \$4,000. This money may be borrowed from the state for fifteen years at four per cent.

The patrons of district No. 1, Eau Pleine, known as the Maple Valley school, have at a special meeting in July voted to construct a new school building during the 1931 summer. This building is to be similar to those in the Maine, Bluff and Lake View districts.

This summer, school boards turned their attention to the furnishing of their schools and in many instances replaced the old desks, maps, and bookcases with new ones. A number of schools were almost completely refurnished. Much painting and redecorating was also done.

My plan is to continue with conferences with school board members wherever and whenever necessary in order to provide comfortable and healthful schoolrooms containing all required and necessary equipment.

Regarding playground equipment it is very advisable to purchase the commercial type with the strongest guarantee backing it. Safety must always be given preference to economy in this case. Home constructed wooden types should be carefully inspected a number of times each year and removed before any tragedy and sorrow befalls the community. It is better to wait a year and be able to afford only the strongest and safest.

Traveling by teachers has received more attention this year than

ever before. Forty-three Portage county teachers have taken the tour to Washington, D. C. the past summer. On December 26 another opportunity for traveling is provided by an eight day tour to Florida and the southland. The material regarding the above was just mailed from the office.

Attendance awards representing masterpieces of art were presented to pupils who were present every day the past year. This will be repeated again this year.

The school board convention was held on June 7 at the State Teachers' college auditorium. The attendance was unusually good and much interest was evidenced in the good things Mr. George S. Dick of the state department of public instruction, had to say regarding the general condition of the public school system. The bands from Junction City and Amherst together with the following numbers provided entertainment on this day:

Without this cooperation our work in dramatics would be decidedly handicapped for these awards prove to be an inspiration to the children.

The traveling trophies donated by Mrs. E. C. Dickerson, formerly Frances C. Bannach, and Mr. Ferdinand Hirzy were won respectively by the Amherst grades where Miss Winifred Harvey and Mrs. Lyle Van Skiver were in charge and the McDill school where Alice Peterson

was in charge and will remain in these schools for one year. It is needless to say that the winners will be spurred on to another victory by the success gained the past year.

An unusual occurrence took place at the county contest this year in that a tie for first place resulted in the scholarship contest. This has never occurred in the past and perhaps may not in the future, but this year Margaret Dopp for the Dopp school with Helen Peterson as her teacher and Frank Fiedler for the Violet school with Bernice Akey as his teacher, were the two young people who earned the Milwaukee trip to the state fair. The state pays the expenses of one contestant and I took the liberty to send both contestants, awaiting the approval of the committee on education and the members of the county board. Both children won the same award and I felt confident that I was carrying out the wishes of the members of the county board in sending both winners. During the fall of 1929 group meetings were held in every part of the county within a reasonable distance of each school. Demonstrations were observed and problems in general were discussed. The group meetings for this year will open Saturday, Nov. 22 in the towns of Eau Claire and Carson and Belmont and Lanark. The improvement of assignments is the aim of our work this year. Actual assignments will be worked out by the teachers coming to these meetings.

The music program is progressing encouragingly. This year an effort is made to provide necessary equipment. It is hoped that the end of the year will see each school possessing a victrola and the necessary records providing a good course in music appreciation. Many schools are already provided with this equipment. The Harmonica and Rhythm bands are increasing in number each year.

We now have three large high school bands in the county. One at Amherst, one at Junction City and one organized this year at Almond. The work accomplished in each band is unusual. The Junction City band participated in the state band tournament at Milwaukee last spring where it won several honors.

The goitre prevention work is going on as usual, but each year the tablets are administered to a larger number of children. This year between 85 and 90 per cent of the children have this attention. The next step forward in our health program should be the diphtheria prevention work. It is hoped that this year the members of the county board will feel willing to sponsor this much needed prevention by voting the necessary appropriation. The Portage County Teachers' association is ready to help promote our health. This makes us one step in advance of the situation a year ago. The resolutions were adopted at the teachers' institute held last September.

During the year 1929-1930 I made 300 visits to 125 schools, attended 90 educational programs and held eleven teachers' institutes.

There are 125 schools in the county with 154 teachers.

The total census was 7,993 persons of school age.

The total number of pupils enrolled was 3,180.

About 5,000 pieces of mail were received in the office and 7,000 pieces were sent out.

Section II. Whereas: The state highway commission has notified the county clerk that a sum of money estimated to be one hundred ninety five thousand one hundred forty five and seventy eight/100 dollars (\$195,145.78) will become available at the end of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1931, under the provisions of subsection (9) of section 20.49 of the statutes, for the improvement of the state and county trunk highway systems in the county, but that its exact amount will not be known until after June 30, 1931, and

Whereas: Twenty per cent of the said sum, or thirty nine thousand twenty nine and sixteen/100 dollars (\$39,029.16) is required by law (subsection 9 of section 84.03) to be set aside for the improvement of the county highway system, in the county; the county highway committee is hereby authorized and directed to expend the said sum for the improvement of the said trunk highway system during 1931 in the following manner, to wit:

Patrol maintenance and such gang maintenance jobs as are deemed advisable by the county highway committee.

Section III. Whereas: The state highway commission has estimated

that the sum of one hundred twenty eight thousand, four hundred ninety four and 29/100 dollars (\$128,494.29) will become available under sub-section (9) of section 84.03, as state aid for improvement of the state trunk highway system in the county in accordance with the provisions of chapter 83 of the statutes:

Be It Resolved: That the said sum, together with a portion of the unallotted reserve available to the credit of Portage county, shall be expended in the following improvements to wit:

1. The sum of One hundred thirty-five thousands and no/100 (\$135,000.00) to retire bonds.

(b) For emergency fund, the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).

Section VIII. Whereas: Appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts available for work in the county under section 20.49 of the statutes, the county board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the county to meet such appropriations as follows:

(a) For county aid under sections 83.14 and 87.01 as provided by sections IV and V hereof, the sum of twenty thousand and nine hundred five and 62/100 dollars (\$20,905.62).

(b) For the various purposes set forth in section VII hereof, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

Section IX. Whereas: The various highway activities, for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor, this board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed, may be used by the county highway committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement of the same class for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year, and any deficit in any highway fund at the end of the year shall be paid from the next appropriation made for the same purpose, and

Whereas: The exact amount of the funds that will become available for highway purposes in the county under section 20.49 of the statutes will not be known until after June 30, 1931 at which time correct figures will be submitted by the state highway commission, the county treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments on account of

the improvements to be made with such funds, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the county treasury that are not required for the purposes for which appropriated prior to August 1, 1930; and to reimburse such funds in the county treasury from the sums received under section 20.49 of the statutes. The county clerk is hereby directed to levy the taxes named in section VIII hereof in the county tax levy, as provided by law, and the county highway committee and the county highway commission are hereby directed to carry out the highway construction and maintenance for which provision is herein made, in the manner provided by law, and to employ such patrolmen, laborers, and foremen, as they may deem necessary for such purpose.

Rules Adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Portage County at the November Session, 1930

- Rule 1. The hour for daily meeting of this board shall be at 9 o'clock a. m. unless otherwise ordered.
- Rule 2. The chairman shall take the chair at the time to which the board stands adjourned, and the board shall then be called to order, and the roll of members called.
- Rule 3. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the clerk, and any mistakes therein may be corrected by the board; provided that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day shall be read by the clerk, and before the final adjournment corrected by the board.
- Rule 4. The chair shall preserve order, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal of the board.
- Rule 5. The chairman shall vote on all questions taken by yeas and nays, except on appeal from his own decisions.
- Rule 6. Every member, previous to his speaking, shall arise and address himself to the chair.
- Rule 7. When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is first to speak. But in all cases, the members who shall first rise and address the chair, shall speak first.
- Rule 8. No motion shall be debated or put unless the same be seconded. It shall be stated by the chairman before debate; and any such motion shall be reduced to writing if any member desires it.
- Rule 9. Every written resolution or motion shall have prefixed thereto the name of the person introducing it. And when ordered by a committee the names of said committee shall be endorsed thereon.
- Rule 10. A vote on any question shall be taken by the yeas and nays when called for by any member of the board.
- Rule 11. No rule of the board shall be suspended, altered or amended without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 12. On the meeting of the board after the reading and the correcting of the journal of the preceding day, the order of business shall be as follows: 1st. Reception of petitions, memorials, etc. 2d. Resolutions may be offered and considered 3d. Reports of committees and consideration thereof. 4th. Consideration of miscellaneous business on the table.
- Rule 13. No account or claim against the county shall be audited unless it be made out in items, and duly verified, and be filed with the clerk of the board in the manner prescribed by law, except as provided by Chapter 153, General Laws of 1868, unless by consent of two-thirds of the members present.
- Rule 14. As amended November, 1898: All resolutions appropriating money shall be voted upon by yeas and nays, and shall not be acted upon until the next day after presentation, without the consent of the majority of the members elected.
- Rule 15. It shall be the duty of the chairman of all committees to report work completed, or progress of work, upon the call of committees according to Rule 12.
