All loads must be covered and secured, or completely enclosed within your vehicle during delivery. Uncovered loads may be refused or subject to a \$10.00 surcharge.

Frequently Asked Questions

What does a 'secure' load mean?

An unsecured load has not been fastened in or attached to the vehicle with tarps, rope, straps, netting, or chains, so as to prevent any part of the load or the covering from becoming loose, detached, or leaving the vehicle while the vehicle is moving. Unsecured loads may be refused or subjected to a \$10.00 surcharge.

Can I dispose of yard materials at the Transfer Facility?

The Transfer Facility cannot accept yard waste or woody debris less than 6 inches in diameter. Contact your local municipal clerk to find out how to dispose of yard waste in your community. Invasive species such as garlic mustard, Japanese knotweed, or buckthorn may be bagged and thrown into the trash to help prevent their spread.

Do you rent dumpsters?

No. Call a local service provider for rentals.

Will someone help me unload?

Solid Waste Department staff does not unload vehicles, please be prepared to unload your materials. Wear appropriate footwear, broken glass and nails may be present.

What do I do with medical wastes?

Medications can be properly disposed of at the Plover or Stevens Point Police Stations or the Portage County Sheriffs Department. Residential sharps can be taken to the Copps Pharmacies in Plover and Stevens Point or the Trigs Pharmacy. There are no fees associated with either program.

How do I dispose of Motor Oil or Antifreeze?

Bring in a sealed 2.5 gallon jug or smaller for free disposal at the Transfer Facility. No rags or debris.

How do I dispose of Hazardous Materials?

Hazardous materials are accepted by appointment only, March-November. Call (715) 346-1931 to make an appointment and for information on fees.
