**6. Summary of Current Actions**

April 6, 2020 @ 1800 PM Public Health DOC/ICS operation day 18.  
4 Positive Cases.

Testing of individuals continues based on 4-tiered testing criteria established by DHS on 03/19/2020. Priority set for testing of individuals in tier I and tier II.

PCHHS-DPH team activities:

- Timely entry and follow-up of PIF/PUI forms/follow-up of cases and contacts
- Monitoring of symptoms of residents at medium or high risk and tested for C-19
- Provide guidance and communication to the community
- Monitor for results

Executive Order #74 suspends in-person voting for the April 7 election, moving it to June 9, 2020.

DHS provides guidance about use of cloth masks for the public and public settings.

Emergency Order #20 Modifies Section I of Emergency Order #16, providing additional information about interstate reciprocity for health care providers.

Emergency Order #21 Suspends Several DHS Administrative Rules for EMS, Home Health Agencies, Hospices, Nursing Homes, Nursing Aide Training Programs, Feeding Assistant Programs, Community Based Residential Facilities, Adult Family Homes, and Narcotic Treatment for Opiate Addiction.

Local education authorities (LEAs) can deliver meals to their students by mail.

DHS releases Weekly Respiratory Report, now includes COVID-19 data.

The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) released a summary of the various personal protective equipment (PPE) procurement efforts and dissemination protocols in Wisconsin.

DHS health officer call at 1400.

- Statewide message on church services expected out soon from DHS,
- PIF updated includes new listing for criteria to be considered for testing at WSLH or MDH
- Some LHDs are closing boat landings to limit mass gatherings

HHS Operations working on creating an isolation facility MOU to use with a smaller local hotel. Waiting on response from motel operator.

Safety message: All staff must maintain social distancing - 6 feet of space between and less than 10 people in a confined space. To minimize contact and maintain social distancing, use Skype and telephone as much as possible.
