6. Summary of Current Actions

CO-VID Health Alert #6 from DHS new website enables health care providers to request COVID-19 lab testing supplies

Timely entry and follow-up of PIF/PUI forms/follow-up of cases and contacts

- Monitoring of symptoms of residents at medium or high risk and tested for C-19
- Provide guidance and communication to the community
- Monitor for results

The CDC Director warned a potential 2nd wave of SARS-CoV-2 late in the year could be more deadly as it will overlap with the influenza season. For herd immunity to occur 80% of the US population must be immune

Badger Bounce Back Plan: 85,000 tests per week, current lab capacity | 55,307/week (supply dependent), hire 1000 epidemiologists. CDC is funding 650+ workers throughout the states.

National Guard is currently doing contact tracing at the state. They will assist with disbursement of PPE's and Lab supplies. Also ready to assist with specimen collection sites for outbreaks or areas with increase # of cases.

CDC released 2 new infographics re: Guidance for Pet owners. 2 cases of COVID-19 were found in cats in NYC, a dog tested positive in Hong Kong, and the tiger at the Bronx Zoo in New York.

State updated Case Toolkit 6-isolation and quarantine release guidance.

Safety message: All staff must maintain social distancing - 6 feet of space between and less than 10 people in a confined space. To minimize contact and maintain social distancing, use Skype and telephone as much as possible. Cloth masks to be worn when going to places of essential service.
