- Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Planning Funding to update Pandemic Plans to address COVID-19 for Local Health Departments (LHDs)
- Federal funding to support contact tracing: investigations, contact tracing and monitoring
- Testing funding to support a public health strategist and community testing
- DHS is working on a distribution formula: Funding available for March 1 – Dec. 31, 2020.
- Exact Sciences: up to analyzing 9000 tests per day/400 workers/updated server to better support Wisconsin Electronic Disease Surveillance System (WEDSS). Currently no back log.

Safety message: All staff must maintain social distancing - 6 feet of space between and less than 10 people in a confined space. To minimize contact and maintain social distancing use Skype and telephone as much as possible. Cloth masks to be worn when going to places of essential service.

Indicator	Metric	Status
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period.	
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of COVID-like syndromic cases reported with a 14-day period.	
Cases	Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period.	
Hospitals	95% of hospitals affirm that they can treat all patients without crisis care.	
Hospitals	95% of all hospitals affirm that they have arranged for testing for all symptomatic clinical staff treating patients at the hospital per CDC guidelines.	
Health care	Downward trend of COVID-19 cases among health care workers calculated weekly.
