- DHS will be releasing recommendations for opening and closing long term care facilities(LTCF). The local health department with consultation from the state will determine if they can open or close. Guidelines will model phases of opening and closing.
- DHS stated the NE region of WI is seeing an increased number of false positives as a result of the testing used, ie., BD Max. State guidelines are still treat them as positive as the cases are still symptomatic.
- CDC released Considerations for Youth Sports.

Alaska Gov. Dunleavy announced the state will require COVID-19 tests for incoming travelers. Tests must be within 72-hours of the trip, or incoming travelers can submit to a rapid test at the airport. Anyone without a test is subject to a 2-week quarantine implemented in March. **[Anchorage Daily News]**

Racine County has the largest number of COVID-19 cases per capita in Wisconsin with 919.7 cases per 100,000 residents. Brown County and Milwaukee County have 904.6 and 849.7 cases per 100,000 residents respectively. **[Urban Milwaukee, WI-DHS]**

Safety message: All staff must maintain social distancing - 6 feet of space between and less than 10 people in a confined space. To minimize contact and maintain social distancing use Skype and telephone as much as possible. Cloth masks to be worn when going to places of essential service
