Total hospitalizations of positive cases in Wisconsin at 13% with 3,268 (+37) hospitalizations. 6 hospitalizations for Portage County.

- **Active Cases:** 4,881 (19%)
- **Recovered cases:** 19,852 (78%)
- **Percent of confirmed cases by race:** American Indian (1%), Asian or Pacific Islander (4%), Black (18%), White (54%), Multiple or other races (12%), Unknown (11%)
- **Percent of confirmed cases by ethnicity:** Hispanic or Latino (32%), Not Hispanic or Latino (56%), Unknown (12%)
- **Emergency Department visits:**
 - ~Influenza like illness: 53 visits on 6/22, compared to previous 3-day average of 36

Daily Frequently Asked Question?

How long does a household contact of a confirmed or probable case need to quarantine?

The quarantine for a household contact is often more than 14 days because of continued exposure while the confirmed or probable case is ill. Day 0 of the mandated 14-day quarantine would be the day the confirmed or probable case ends their isolation.

Safety message: All staff must maintain social distancing - 6 feet of space between and less than 10 people in a confined space. To minimize contact and maintain social distancing. Face masks to be worn.

Symptoms	Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period.	
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of COVID-like syndromic cases reported with a 14-day period.	
Cases	Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period.	
Hospitals	95% of hospitals affirm that they can treat all patients without crisis care.	
Hospitals	95% of all hospitals affirm that they have arranged for testing for all symptomatic clinical staff treating patients at the hospital per CDC guidelines.	
Health care	Downward trend of COVID-19 cases among health care workers calculated weekly.
