14:00 DHS HO Forum Call

- Environmental and Occupational Health is going to be issuing guidance around outbreaks in worksites. The guidance is for employers and employees. A draft will be shared for input with HO's and the final product will hopefully be out by the end of next week.
- The CDC guidance for return to work for exposed employees is very different than DHS and there was a lot of discussion around what guidance should be used
- There is a request for all schools of higher education being invited to the table to discuss testing needs for the fall semester. Private schools seem willing to participate but there has not been a good response from the WI Technical College system. Discussion will continue with the UW system
- An update on the current DHS funding to LHD is due out on Monday, June 29, 2020
- Follow-up discussion to take place on the effectiveness of symptom management calls as many jurisdictions report that people are getting upset with the numerous calls and are becoming uncooperative.

Indicator	Metric	Status
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period.	
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of COVID-like syndromic cases reported with a 14-day period.	
Cases	Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period.	
Hospitals	95% of hospitals affirm that they can treat all patients without crisis care.	
Hospitals	95% of all hospitals affirm that they have arranged for testing for all symptomatic clinical staff treating patients at the hospital per CDC guidelines.	
Health care	Downward trend of COVID-19 cases among health care workers calculated weekly.

red indicator = gating criteria not met
