Total hospitalizations of positive cases in Wisconsin at 12% with 3,519 (+37) hospitalizations. 11 total hospitalizations for Portage County, 5 current.

- Active cases: 5,414 (18%). Active cases in Portage Co.: 65 (40%)
- Percent of confirmed cases by race: American Indian (1%), Asian or Pacific Islander (4%), Black (18%), White (56%), Multiple or other races (12%), Unknown (10%)
- Percent of confirmed cases by ethnicity: Hispanic or Latino (31%), Not Hispanic or Latino (58%), Unknown (11%)
- Emergency Department visits:
 - ~Influenza like illness: 44 visits on 6/29, compared to previous 3-day average of 46
 - ~COVID-19 like illness: 140 visits on 6/29, compared to previous 3-day average of 151
- Total hospital bed utilization: 77%

Symptoms	Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period.	
Symptoms	Downward trajectory of COVID-like syndromic cases reported with a 14-day period.	
Cases	Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period.	
Hospitals	95% of hospitals affirm that they can treat all patients without crisis care.	
Hospitals	95% of all hospitals affirm that they have arranged for testing for all symptomatic clinical staff treating patients at the hospital per CDC guidelines.	
Health care	Downward trend of COVID-19 cases among health care workers calculated weekly.


