

PORTAGE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

ANNEX G (PUBLIC WORKS AND ENGINEERING)

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PURPOSE

This annex describes how Portage County will coordinate with the municipalities and private utility companies with providing public works services; assessing the damage to infrastructure and buildings; restoring and maintaining essential services and providing technical assistance through specialized personnel, equipment and supplies.

CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

The county will support the municipalities by ensuring that the infrastructure and buildings in the community are safe for use after a disaster or creating, through demolitions or repairs, a safe condition.

Public works and engineering personnel should identify mitigation opportunities to reduce future disaster damages and make recommendations as appropriate.

During the recovery phase, all agencies are expected to support continuing operations with equipment and staff.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND TASKS

A. County Public Works Department

Response

1. Survey damages to infrastructure, buildings and equipment in disaster areas. Develop and make recommendations to alleviate problems.
2. Clear or barricade County and State roads and bridges. Assist towns and villages with road clearing if needed and as resources are available.
3. Assist with search and rescue operations if needed and as resources are available.
4. Coordinate with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for debris removal and disposal.
5. Assist utility companies with emergency service shut-off if needed.
6. Coordinate with essential services and utility companies during the restoration and maintenance of essential services (i.e., electricity, fuel, water, gas, sewage disposal, telephone, cable television, and garbage collection) to the affected area.

7. Coordinate mutual aid and private contractors with the county public works department, the Incident Commander and the EOC.
8. Coordinate with law enforcement to maintain evacuation routes, identify potential problems and ensure safety along those routes.
9. Assess damages and coordinate with the health department on decontamination of water and water testing.
10. Oversee flood control activities in coordination with the EOC.
11. Maintain contact and coordinate operations with public and private utility representatives.

Recovery

1. Continue to maintain, clear and repair the infrastructure system until normal operations are restored.
2. Reassess the situation and reassign or dismiss resources as necessary.
3. Compile and document disaster damages and report them to County Emergency Management.
4. Assist with the Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) and disaster declaration process as requested.

Resources

1. For resource lists of County Highway Department and Stevens Point Streets Department equipment see Attachment 4. For resource lists of the equipment owned by the nine villages, see Attachment 5. For resource lists of equipment owned by the seventeen towns, see Attachment 6.

B. County Emergency Management

Response

1. Maintain contact and coordinate operations with public and private utility representatives.
2. Establish priorities for the restoration of essential services.

Recovery

1. Compile and document disaster damages and report them to WEM.
2. Assist with the Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) and disaster declaration process as requested.

C. Essential Services and Utility Companies

Response

1. Coordinate with Incident Commander the EOC and other public and private agencies for emergency service shut-off.
2. Coordinate the restoration and maintenance of essential services (i.e., electricity, fuel, gas, telephone, cable television, garbage collection, and water and sewer services) to the affected areas.

Recovery

1. Continue to restore essential services
2. Maintain essential services operations.
3. Compile and document damages and report then to County Emergency Management.
4. Assist with the Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) and disaster declaration process as needed.

PUBLIC WORKS AND ENGINEERING

ALL-HAZARDS RESPONSE CHECKLIST

1. Dispatch public works/engineering personnel to determine the extent of the damage.
2. Join unified command structure as emergency situation dictates.
3. Brief County Emergency Management Director on status of emergency.
4. Initiate alerting procedures, which may include notifying public works staff, county and other local agencies, external support services, and district highway personnel.
5. Ensure that personal protection protocols have been implemented.
6. Prioritize use of personnel and resources to provide for continuity of existing services.
7. Advise staff of all key operational locations (EOC, JPIC, field command post, shelters, staging areas, etc.).
8. Assign public works/engineering coordinator to EOC if activated.
9. Assist Emergency Management Director in compiling UDSR and other damage assessment reports related to any public facility damage.
10. Coordinate the deployment of public works/engineering personnel to the affected area to perform such activities as:
 - a. Assisting law enforcement in securing area and controlling traffic, controlling access points;
 - b. Assisting in urban, search and rescue activities;
 - c. Record keeping;
 - d. Establishing emergency communications to the EOC, dispatch center, or field command post;
 - e. Prioritizing debris removal.
 - f. Prioritize and coordinate the use of generators, emergency lighting, fuel supplies;

- g. Provide barricades and signs for road closures;
 - h. Assist in identifying and obtaining appropriate resources to support response and recovery operations;
 - i. Provide engineering expertise in inspecting damage to public structures, roads, bridges, buildings and other infrastructure.
11. Coordinate with other emergency groups in carrying out evacuation, including maintaining transportation routes.
 12. Transport key public officials, emergency workers, resources, medical supplies, food, and other essential needs.
 13. Check inventory to determine resources immediately available.
 14. Request mutual aid or other assistance, if necessary, and coordinate deployment to scene of incident or to staging area.
 15. Advise staff of public information procedures then coordinate and report any public information releases to the designated PIO.
 16. Coordinate with utility companies in prioritizing the restoration of services.
 17. Provide for rest periods and shift changes for emergency workers. Feeding of emergency workers should be coordinated through the EOC, if activated.
 18. Coordinate with utility companies for the shutdown of gas and electric services.
 19. Maintain accurate records of disaster related expenditures including debris clearance, emergency protective measures, damage to public facilities, and other damage information as appropriate.
 20. Refer to Annex G, Public Works/Engineering of the County EOP for overall public works operations.

PUBLIC WORKS AND ENGINEERING ALL-HAZARD RECOVERY CHECKLIST

1. Ensure continued staffing of EOC and field command post as necessary.
2. Prioritize use of personnel and equipment to provide for continuity of existing services.
3. Brief County Emergency Management Director on status of recovery.
4. Working within the incident command system, assist with the following actions:
 - a. Continue to assist law enforcement in securing the area and in removal of necessary security measures as appropriate;
 - b. Continue prioritized debris removal;
 - c. Coordinate determination of disposal site according to DNR regulations.
 - d. Continue to service temporary utility arrangement (i.e., generators, lighting, fuel supplies, etc.).
5. Request and deploy outside assistance to expedite recovery efforts as needed.
6. Keep Public Information Officer (PIO) advised of recovery efforts.
7. Assist with transportation and engineering needs for re-entry of evacuated population.
8. Debrief staff, participate in critiques, and revise plans as necessary.
9. Release additional personnel as appropriate and phase out mutual aid.
10. Compile and document disaster-related expenses for emergency management director (include damage to infrastructure and public buildings/equipment, mutual aid costs, etc.). Provide maps of damaged areas.
11. Assist County Emergency Management Director in compiling UDSR or other damage assessment reports.

12. Accompany State/Federal engineering teams, as assigned by the county emergency management director, and participate in PDA process.
13. If a presidential disaster is declared, coordinate as assigned with State/Federal engineering teams in completing damage survey reports.
14. Debrief emergency workers and arrange for crisis counseling and/or CISD as necessary.
